

As readers and authors we will:

listen to poems and stories about journeys, joining in with rhymes and repeated refrains.

We will write recounts following our train ride to Hebden Bridge, remembering to use full stops and capital letters.

We will use the story of The Naughty Bus to create our own stories about the adventures of a vehicle, linking this with Computing to create a digital story.

We will use puppets and props to retell the story of the 3 Billy Goats Gruff.

We will join words and clauses using 'and'.

We will practise adding the endings -ing, -ed and -er to verbs where no change is needed to the root word.

We will add -er and -est to adjectives where no change is needed to the root word and practise using the prefix -un.

As mathematicians we will:

solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher.

We will recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

We will recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

We will describe position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.

discuss living in the wider world, including our responsibilities as global citizens.
