

As readers and authors we will:

be looking at different versions of the traditional tale of Jack and the Beanstalk. We will be using drama and writing to retell the story, looking at describing the characters and how they feel. In SPaG we will be looking at using adjectives to describe. We will also continue to work on using plurals s, es and suffixes ing, ed, er, est where the root word stays the same.



As mathematicians we will:

count forwards and backwards from 100, or from any given number. Write numbers to 100 in numerals. Count to 100 from any given number. Given a number find one more and one less than 100. Show understanding of numbers to 100 using tens and ones to represent the value of the digits.

Continue to practise number bonds to 10 and 20. Begin to measure time on the hour and half past the hour.

Continue practising counting in 2s, 5s, 10s.



As members of our community we will:

be looking at how to use public services in our community, such as a library.

In geography we will:

draw and create basic maps both real and fictional.
