Girls' Football

At Savile Park we are continuously looking at ways to improve our lunch time provision, to ensure our children are able to experience a wide range of activities and experiences. We also work very hard to ensure we are inclusive for all. Following on from the Lionesses World Cup win and their continued success, we have listened to our Student Voice. We are now dedicating one day each week to girls' football. This is to encourage the girls to take part in more sports and to build their confidence in participation. Book Week 6 March - 10 March 2023


We sent you a letter on the 10 February regarding book week.
