

At Savile Park we teach with topic-based curriculum, which means we link our Geography learning with our English work and other lessons across the curriculum. Each term or half term pupils begin a new and exciting topic linking to the national curriculum aims. Some of our fantastic Geography topics focus on our local area, including:

- Toffee Town (Year 4)
- Shibden Hall and the Piece Hall (Year 2)
- Our School and Our Country (Year 1)

Other topics focus on the world we live in and other places looking at:

- Europe (Year 3)
- South Africa (Year 2)
- Polar regions (Reception and Year 1)

We also learn about the natural wonders of our world including:

- Mountains and Volcanoes (Year 3)
- Water (Year 6)
- Rainforests (Year 5)

All these topics allow pupils to learn and deepen their understanding about the diverse world around them. This learning and understanding shows in the fantastic work they produce and displays around school.



To engage and enthuse our learners at Savile Park we incorporate trips and fieldwork into our Geography learning as much as possible.

Children use map skills, compasses, digital mapping and also complete investigations.

Some fieldwork we have done this year includes trips to Marsden, Halifax local area walks and the Piece Hall. Upcoming trips include Lytham St Annes and Whitby. These are fantastic opportunities for children to put their skills as a geographer into practice!



There are so many ways we can include Geography learning at home from reception right up to Year 6.

- Draw maps between your house and school to follow
- Find holiday destinations or family's homes on google maps or globes
