


Firstly, thank you to each and every one of you that took the time to complete the questionnaire and provide your feedback and comments.


Overall we had a total of 223 responses, which represents just over 57% of the School population.


Below are the results to the specific questions asked.








































As you can see from the results above, it is very pleasing to see that the majority of the responses are positive and this was also reflected in the comments we received regarding the strengths of the School – a selection of these are below.

We are also grateful for the comments we received on how we can improve and address things going forward. This feedback allows School to continue to evolve and reflect on procedures.

It would be very difficult for us to respond to each individual comment so we have grouped them into similar themes.

Communication

Communication was highlighted in a large amount of comments. Some people feel that it has improved but there were concerns that some communication was not sent out in a timely manner. Whilst we do endeavour to ensure correspondence is sent out with good notice, we accept that on occasions we have failed to do this. We are looking into ways this can be improved going forward.

We will continue to send out monthly newsletters about the goings on in school and the half term overview will be provided, so everyone is aware what their child will be learning in all areas of the curriculum. The website and the Facebook page will be updated as often as possible and reminders regularly sent about important information via text message.

<u>After School Wraparound Care & Extra Curricular Clubs</u>

Over the past academic year we have successfully introduced the Late Larks After School Provision. Going forward we hope for this to continue to grow, and hope to introduce specific clubs into specific evenings during the week, which your child could attend and take part in.

We are also hopeful that a new minibus will arrive in the next few weeks (this has been delayed due to external issues). The bus will be used to take Moorfield Children to Late Larks removing the necessity to walk.

Children also take part in a rolling programme of extra-curricular clubs at lunchtime throughout the year. Further communication will be sent out regarding this in the new academic year.

Parking

The Calderdale School Streets initiative which has seen Moorfield St closed at peak times, has proved successful, with many people commenting how much the environment around School has improved at dropping off and picking up time.

Unfortunately, we still have issues at Heath, with general use of the top car park. Whilst we do send reminders out to parents that it is for blue badge holders only, these messages are not heeded by a small minority of parents and cars are being driven into the car park, on a daily basis, when they shouldn't be. We are always looking into ways that a resolution can be found to solve this problem however, this has to be within school budgets and not compromise our staff ratios and safety.

Dinners

We are in regular contact with both suppliers providing feedback when necessary at ways they could improve things for our students. Menus are provided termly, and meal patterns can be changed by contacting the office at the beginning of each half term.

Pupil Progress

Comments were received that School does not provide enough feedback to parents around pupil progress. As well as the two parent evenings in the Autumn and Spring terms, parents have the opportunity for an informal drop in with class teachers following the release of the pupil annual
