Be moving onto consolidating the four calculation methods, if you require any information about how to support your child with this - please get in touch!





As scientists we will be:

Recapping our knowledge of electricity and circuits.

- Investigating ways in which the brightness of a bulb or speed of a motor is changed.
- Recognising and using conventional symbols for circuits
- Assessing our understanding of circuits.

As athletes we will be:

- Developing ball skills, reaction/response and cognitive skills.
- Taking part in attacking and defending games such as football
- Continuing to develop our fundamental movement skills including balance and balance with a ball
