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

The national school attendance target is 95%.

You will notice that the accumulated minutes late equates to 133.33 hours lost in your children's learning. It is essential that your child arrives to school on time ready for their learning, you might be surprised to learn that:

# Arriving late can affect your child's attendance! Every minute counts.



(figures below are calculated over a school year)				
5 minutes late each day	3 days lost!			
10 minutes late each day	6.5 days lost!			
15 minutes late each day	10 days lost!			
20 minutes late each day	13 days lost!			
30 minutes late each day	19 days lost			



As few as 19 missed days over the school year reduces your child's chances of success. Your child's SAT could drop by one grade across all subjects.

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Do not let your child miss out! Remember school starts at 8.45 am



### What can you do:

- Have a regular routine for the start of each day
- Help your child get their clothes and equipment ready before they go to bed
- Set a reasonable bedtime to make sure they get enough sleep

Get your child to school on time. If they are late they have a bad start to the day.

### If you child arrives late for class:

- They miss out on important learning, which could affect their achievement
- They do not have the social time to settle into class
- It can be embarrassing for them
- They may disrupt the learning of the rest of the class
