As Linguists we will be:


- continuing to increase our French vocabulary and

As Athletes we will be:


- Working on our creative skills whilst focussing on our movement skills; sending and receiving and counter balance with a partner. We will be incorporating some basketball skills in PE.

- Looking at changes of state in the water cycle.




As Musicians we will be:
