Continuing to revise our knowledge of French ensuring that we speak clearly with good pronunciation.

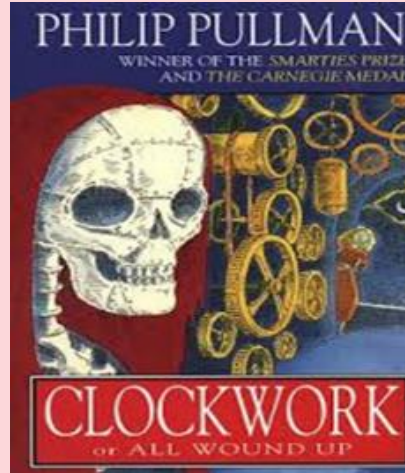
