Throughout the day the children took part in a number of exciting challenges. These included problem solving escape rooms, budget planning activities where children applied real life money skills and maths inspired art work. These all encouraged team work, resilience and critical thinking, whilst showing how much fun maths can be.



Puffins and Pelicans Space Dome Experience

Year 2 were extremely lucky to experience the amazing Space Dome. We explored the wonders of space! We learned about the moon's craters and why astronauts need special suits due to the lack of pressure. We discussed why Earth's rotation causes night and day and why stars are easier to see in the countryside than in big cities. We discovered the story of Neil Armstrong and watched clips from the Apollo 11 moon landing, learning how close the mission came to running out of fuel.

We also explored space exploration beyond the moon, including icy oceans of Europa and the incredible landing of the Perseverance Rover on Mars. Finally we enjoyed identifying constellations such as the Big Dipper and learning that the stars are still in the sky during the day- we just cannot see them because of the sun's light. We all had an amazing time at this wonderfully immersive encounter.

Science Week

It will be used to inspire experiments and discussions. During the week the children will be involved in a number of interesting activities and celebrate all things science!
