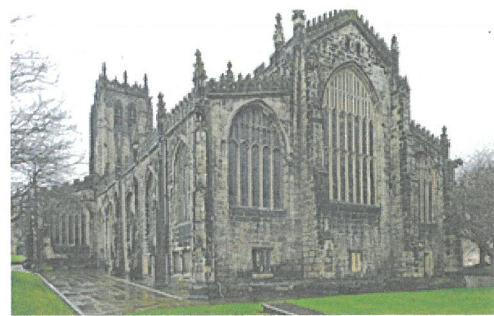
Fingers crossed for some lovely weather!

If you would like to discuss your child's report we have a drop-in session on Wednesday 15 July between 3.15 pm - 4.15 pm. No need to book just turn up.

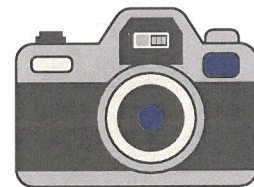


## Class Photographs

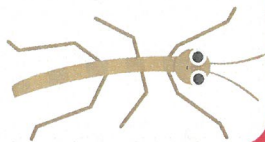
## Living Creatures

Reception and Year 2 have been busy learning about living things and their habitats through real hands-on experiences.

Reception have been watching with great excitement as their butterfly larvae transformed through each stage of metamorphosis, finally emerging as beautiful butterflies.

Year 2, meanwhile, have been carefully looking after a group of stick insects, learning about their needs, habitats, and how to handle them gently and responsibly.

These activities have helped both classes develop curiosity, empathy, and a deeper understanding of the natural world.



## NSPCC Speak Out Stay Safe Workshop

Years 2, 5 and 6 all took part in workshops run by the NSPCC.

Speak out Stay safe is a safeguarding programme that aims to equip a generation of children with the knowledge they need to stay safe from abuse and neglect.

It is designed to help children aged 5 to 11 years understand:

- abuse in all its forms and how to recognise the signs of abuse
- that abuse is never a child's fault and they have the right to be safe
