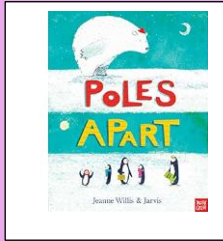


As Readers and authors we will be:

- Reading, discussing, understanding and re-writing the stories **Poles Apart** by Jeanne Willis and **Lost and Found** by Oliver Jeffers
- Learning about and understand how and when to use the prefix -un and suffixes including -er, -est, -ing and -ed.
- Writing non-fiction fact files about animals you would find in the polar regions such as penguins and polar bears.



As mathematicians we will be:

- Counting, reading and writing numbers up to 100
- Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s to 100.
- Strengthening addition and subtraction skills
- Solving one-step problems involving multiplication and division with the use of objects, pictures and groups and teacher support
- Recognising coins and notes.
- Using addition and subtraction to solve problems involving money.
- Telling the time to the hour and half past.
- Solving problems involving time.

As artists we will be:

- Mark making using different types of media.
- Practising using a range of techniques to make marks with different effects.

- Describing the simple properties of a variety of everyday materials.
- Comparing and grouping together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple properties.

As musicians we will be:

- Having fun with improvisation. This will allow us to create music that belongs to us and be able to express our feelings and ideas. During this half term we will be listening to different genres of music, singing, playing, composing and improvising and finally, performing.



In geography we will be:

- Using atlases to locate places in the world and name the seven continents.
- Locating hot and cold places in relation to the equator.
- Learning about hot and cold places in the world.
- Making simple comparisons between different places.
- Identifying seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK.
